## RULES

1. Split players into two teams, and space the racks 10 to 30 feet apart, depending on skill level.
2. A player from Team 1 stands beside one rack and tosses three bolas in a row at the opposite rack. Once the player has thrown all three bolas, a player from Team 2 throws three bolas at Team 1's rack.
3. A round is complete when two opposing players have each thrown three bolas.
4. The winning team of each round throws first in the following round.

## H/t/ poinis

- Bolas landing on the top rung earn $\mathbf{3}$ points; the middle, $\mathbf{2}$ points; and the bottom, $\mathbf{1}$ point.
- Bolas that land on the stand or get wrapped around the upright earn no points.
- If a player lands a bola on the same rung as one on the opposing rack, the points cancel each other out.
- A player can earn 1 bonus point in each round if (a) all three bolas land on one rung and the opposing player doesn't land a bola on the same rung, or (b) one bola lands on each rung and the opposing player does not land a bola on any rung. Teams must score exactly $\mathbf{2 1}$ points to win. In the last round, a player scoring more points than needed to win gets $\mathbf{O}$ points that round.
- In the event of a tie, a team needs a $\mathbf{2}$-point advantage to win.
- The first team to score exactly $\mathbf{2 1}$ points wins!

## Jim Beam Black ${ }^{\circledR}$

 Kentucky Cooler
## Ingredients

1 ounce Jim Beam Black ${ }^{\circledR}$ Bourbon
lemon flavored hot tea
2 tablespoons honey
2 lemon wedges
$1 / 2$ ounce triple sec or orange liqueur
1 ounce rock candy syrup
splash ginger ale

## Mixing

Brew tea, squeeze in 1 lemon
wedge and add honey while hot to dissolve. Chill. Pour tea into glass. Add remaining ingredients. Garnish with min sprig and remaining lemon wedge, sliced to sit on rim of glass.

## Ingredients
